Research Log guidance for centres for June 2016

The following are possible examples of elements of a research log. They are not intended to be prescriptive and centres may devise their own format. They key requirements are

- 1. There should be evidence of a log submitted with the report.
- 2. The log should be used when writing the report.
- 3. The log should be maintained throughout the research process.
- 4. The log must be effective in helping the report to meet the requirements for the use, analysis and evaluation of evidence and perspectives in order to reach a reasoned conclusion which is the subject of reflection.
- 5. The log should be useful to centres when monitoring progress, conducting the final interview and in confirming the declaration that the work is the candidate's own.

This log shows the process from initial idea to title and shows how the candidate had a constructive dialogue and modified ideas and developed the plan.

Record of sources used (sample extract from research log)

Centres should submit sample sheets from throughout the process to show how they have used sources. It would be acceptable to include sheets from the beginning, middle and end of the research process. It is not expected that every source used should be included. Candidates should select notes on research done throughout the time allocated for the project.

The log above shows the date and the source. The source is analysed in 'Key ideas' and there are some indications of evaluation in the final column and for further research. A series of extracts would show that the Log was being maintained through research period, that it was being used and that it was being effective in helping with Analysis and Evaluation (AO1) and was driving the research process.

Centres should submit no more than **a sample** of examples of the records of tutorials/seminars /lectures with analysis of the effects on the research and/or the writing of the report included as part of the log. A series of entries would show the log was being maintained, that it was being used and that it was being effective in driving research.
